Children Using Seatbelts in the Backseat Saves Lives, Reduces Injuries, and Saves Money!

- In 2011, every month an average of nine children (15 and younger) in NYS who did not wear a seatbelt were injured severely enough to require hospital treatment; one of whom sustained injuries serious enough to require inpatient hospitalization.
- In 2011, 461 backseat occupants (15 and younger) in NYS who did not wear a seatbelt were treated at a hospital for their injuries.
 - Treatment of these injuries resulted in almost **\$3.1 million** in emergency department and hospitalization charges.
- Among motorists who were involved in a motor vehicle crash, those who were unrestrained were almost *four times* more likely to require hospitalization than those who buckled up. The resulting average hospital charge was almost \$28,000 higher for those unrestrained.
- Unrestrained motorists involved in a crash are **twice** as likely to suffer a traumatic brain injury compared to those wearing a seatbelt.
