The intent of the Amusement Permit is to notify Village Officials, Police, Fire and EMT/Ambulance that an event is taking place in an Amusement Area. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to contact the Village Code Enforcement Officer, NYS Department of Labor, County Health Department and any other agencies to obtain the necessary inspections/approvals prior to holding your event." A motion was made by Deputy-Mayor DiLiberto to amend the existing Amusement Permit; Trustee Grant-Fletcher seconded the motion.
